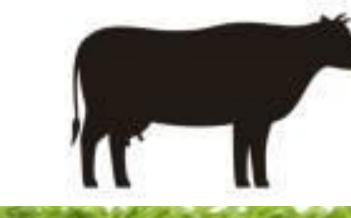


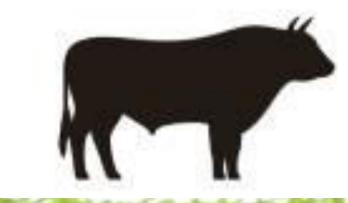

Chicken eggs

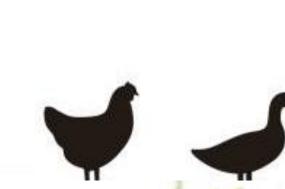
Indication: Numbers correspond to the PCB isomers. Framed congeners are dioxin-like PCBs. Circle with PCBs are the high excreted
